PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

By the time you receive this newsletter our show "NO RESTRICTIONS"

at the BBAC will have ended. I hope you had a chance to see this wonderful show. Opening night was snowy, icy and frigid - our usual weather - and it was difficult for many people to attend. There was another opening in an adjacent gallery so that there was a good crowd. It was a beautiful exhibit of the range that is fiber: woven scarves, stoles, a runner, collage, jacquards, felting, beadwork, basketry, quilting, free-form knitting, crocheting with wire and beads, hand made paper, shibori, discharge, dyeing, stitchery. An amazing display of talent and they are all members of our guild!

There were 30 member/exhibitors and 42 pieces in the show. Rebecca Hart, curator from the Detroit Institute Of Arts, was the juror. I understand that the pieces that were not accepted were also so good we could have put together a great show of rejects. Elaine Borruso and her committee deserve a round of applause. Elaine's hard work, planning and enthusiasm resulted in an excellent exhibit that we should all be proud of.

At our meeting on January 15 Mollie Fletcher presented a lecture on the tapestry artist Helena Hernmarck. Mollie worked for Hernmarck and is a friend so we were treated to a very personal presentation.

Unfortunately, it was to have been a slide lecture but the library's slide projector wasn't working and an overhead projector was substituted but very inadequate. Mollie was a trouper and lectured anyway and even offered to return and repeat the program with a working projector. On Saturday Mollie led a Wedge Weave workshop that was fun and a good learning experience and, hopefully, will result in lots of samplers for "show and tell".

February 19 is our next meeting and Mary Underwood will present a video/lecture on the felt process in Mongolia. She has been to Mongolia several times and studied the felt making process of desert nomads. I'm looking ...continued on next page

OUTREACH OPPORTUNITIES

SPREAD THE WORD ABOUT WEAVING AND RELATED FIBERARTS

The Royal Oak Public Library, and other Southeastern Michigan public libraries have as their theme for the Summer Reading Program, "Be Creative at Your Library." I have volunteered to coordinate a program in weaving and other fiberarts for the Royal Oak Library. Approximately 1,200 children, mostly of elementary school age, participate in this program in Royal Oak. As a part of the Michigan Weavers Guild mission to preserve the fiberarts traditions, I am asking for volunteers from our group to demonstrate and /or teach one of these arts at the Royal Oak Library on a very informal basis in the time period from June 20 - August 1, 2009. About ten of our members have already volunteered.

What volunteering involves, at a minimum, is an hour or two in a morning or afternoon, during the above time period, to share your skill with the children--our future members and carriers-on of fiber arts traditions.

Your commitment can be as little as demonstrating a fiber art for an hour, giving several children a chance to try a skill on a one-time basis, to an extended class, such as knitting. Because we are all busy people and because of vacation schedules, I envision most of our commitments as very short term demonstrations and one-time classes with the children. 


