

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hi all,
May is just around the corner as I write this & spring has clearly arrived with its many colors & perfumes. For MWG spring culminates in our annual pot luck luncheon, moth market & fashion show. It's always a fun time, sharing what we have created both in food & fiber objects. For me personally it means the end of my two years as President and a time of looking back at what was accomplished & forward at what is to come. It should mean turning over the Presidency to a new President with Board Member changes and new programs to look forward to next fall. For the Board and the general membership it usually means new leadership and some changes but pretty much business as usual. However, this coming year of 2010-2011 will be different because of changes the Board and I have proposed. Let me describe them to you.

As you probably noticed our attendance at meetings has grown a bit smaller and membership has declined in the last few years. Membership now numbers in the forties. The Board & I has been discussing this and trying to find a way to increase attendance at meetings & attract new members. A proposal was developed with many goals that we will continue to work on next year. The following are the goals we propose for 2010-2011:

- Change the number of program meetings to 5 (from the current 8): Sept., Oct., Jan., March & May
- Change the meeting date to Saturday afternoon - probably from 1:00 - 3:00; eliminate or shorten the business meeting.
- Possibly change where we currently meet at the Farmington Library to another site
- Increase emphasis on study groups; the Explore Group has been successful allowing "something for everyone"; attempt to collaborate/re-align with Cross Borders Weavers and/or other groups; create more flexible study groups similar to how book clubs are run
- Create a less formal organizational structure de-emphasizing or revamping the bylaws; officers suggested are President, VP or President's Assistant, Program Chair, Newsletter Editor, Webmaster, Membership/Treasurer
- Hold board meetings separate from program meetings or via email
- More communication through email or "blasts" via our website
- Try to have at least two workshops a year

These are ambitious changes we are proposing but we as a Board are hoping that these proposals will generate new ideas, enthusiasm & new members. As you will see in the report from the Nominating Committee Chair, Judy Boesky, we were unable to fill the President's position & there will be Co-Chairs instead of a president next year. As in many organizations there is a need for those willing to volunteer their time to make it work & remain vital. It has been a struggle attracting new people to serve on the Board and we are hoping that the changes we suggest will bring new & younger members interested in the fiber arts who will help provide the stimulation, leadership, ideas & interest we need.

EXCERPTS FROM APRIL MEETING

The April 15, 2010 meeting of MWG was called to order at 10:10 AM by president Arlene Gendelman. Present were Arlene Gendelman, Nancy Slutsky, Ken Allen, Bill Horning, Mary Rios, Susan Lolli, Judy Boesky, Nancy Peck, Andrea Anderson, Karen Folland. **Treasurer:** Nancy Slutsky presented the report showing a balance of \$4,336.27, not including the memorial fund. We are at a break-even point at this time. Nancy went through the checks received for the memorial fund and made a list of all contributors, which she sent to Laura Lipson.

Exhibits: The Costick Exhibit will be from November 19, 2010-January 7, 2011. The trunk sale will be Saturday, Nov. 20, 2010. You must be entered in the exhibit to sell your work in the trunk show. Individuals will take care of their own state sales tax. A form can be obtained from the internet. More information will be forthcoming.

Bill Horning will arrange an exhibit for 2011 together with the Michigan Surface Design Association. The site will be announced later.

Fiber Fare: Next Deadline is April 25.

Publicity: Judy Boesky will place a notice in major magazines announcing the Madelyn van der Hoogt lecture in honor of Margaret Windeknecht and Jean Brudzinski. September she will send local publications the announcement.

Plans are proceeding for the summer workshops at Hope College and the exhibit which will be held August 20 through September 14 at Kendall School of Art & Design in Grand Rapids.

Webmaster: Mary Rios will set up a face book page with a link from our website as another means of communication and publicity for our group. She will also contact Jeanne Seitz to discuss newsletter options.

Program: May will be our annual meeting, potluck lunch, moth market, member sale, and show and tell of members' work.

Suggested changes for 2010/2011 year are to schedule 5 Saturday meetings; try to schedule 2 well known people for programs or workshops; and have more special interest study groups.
