


Join us for a Field Trip on Saturday, November 19, 2016

# "American Style and Spirit: 130 Years of Fashion and Lives of an Entrepreneurial Family" at The Henry Ford Museum

Walk through a living catalog of American style spanning 130 years. Rare in scope and detail, selected clothing from the collection brings the lives of the entrepreneurial Roddis family into sharp focus through fashion. Dozens of wearable time capsules — discovered carefully boxed up in the attic — tell an engaging epic of American style and spirit.

Letters, photographs and heirloom objects bring to life the person behind each garment. As American as aspiration, the clothing reveals a sense of self-expression against a backdrop of history.

## Guild History The Michigan Weavers Guild was formed in 1947.

#### 60 Years Ago - November 1956

Mr. Zielinski of Pulford, Quebec presented a lecture on Color and Design. The meeting was held at one of the members home where a non-guild workshop was given by Mr. Zielinski. The looms were available to see the results of the workshop.

#### 50 Years Ago - November 1966

Guest speaker was Harriet Tidball who covered "interesting and inspirational ideas on design, closing with a do-it-yourself project'.

#### 40 Years Ago - November 1976

No specific information for November was found, but that year the guild had 197 members.

#### 30 Years Ago - November 1986

A Sale and Exhibit of more than 100 weavers work was held at the Orchard Mall, Maple Rd and Orchard Lake Rd. in Mall West Bloomfield, Michigan. The following picture was part of the publicity in the Observer & Eccentric Newspaper.

## Michigan Weavers Guild Presents a Workshop by Robyn Spady "The Thrill of a Twill"

**Robyn Spady** was introduced to handweaving as baby with her handwoven baby blanket woven by her great-grandmother. Inspired by her *blankie*, she learned to weave at a young age and has been weaving for over 40 years. She completed HGA's Certificate of Excellence (COE) in 2004 with the specialized study *Loom-controlled Stitched Double Cloth*. Robyn is fascinated by the infinite possibilities of crossing threads and loves coming up with new ideas to create fabric and transform it into something new and exciting. She is committed to turning the weaving world on to double-faced fabrics, four-shaft weaves, uncommon and advanced weave structures, and passementerie techniques. Robyn is also the founder and editor of *Heddlecraft* magazine.

**Workshop Description:** If you know how to weave and would love to create original patterns and then weave them into a variety of designs, then this workshop is for you! This class is for the weaver looking to further their knowledge about twills with an emphasis on advancing and networked twills, but will also cover corkscrew twills and echo weaves. Students will understand how to draft and weave advancing, networked, and integrated twills. They will also explore how versatile a single threading can be and weave a sampler with a variety of patterns and designs. Four-shaft loom minimum; eight shafts recommended.

Level: Adventure-seeking beginner to Advanced

**Workshop Format:** (Note: This is not a round-robin workshop. You will work on your own loom.) **Students to supply:** Pre-warped loom, shuttles, bobbins, wefts per leader's instructions, scissors, etc.

Dates: Thursday, April 20 and Friday, April 21, 2017

Deadline for registration is February 18, 2017

**Time:** 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

**Workshop fee**: \$160 for Michigan Weavers Guild members and \$195 for non-members, includes \$15 supply fee.
