

Speaker: Robyn Spady

"Weaving Innovations From the Bateman Collection"



Dr. William G. Bateman created a collection of woven samples that is ominous and impressive, but largely unseen since Dr. Bateman's work far exceeds the samples included in the six monographs published in the 1980's by the Shuttle Craft Guild. In this presentation, participants will be presented with some of Dr. Bateman's most innovative work and how he took some weave structures to new heights. Examples of his own weaves will be presented in addition to examples of more traditional weaves.

Per Robyn Spady: Weaving has always been a part of my life. It started with my baby blanket handwoven by my great-grandmother. While growing up, it helped instill in me a sense of creativity and confidence at a time when my self esteem was developing. During my years while working, in what I like to call "Corporate America", weaving helped give me sanity and feel a sense of productivity, which was very important while working on long-term projects when day-to-day progress was not evident.

Robyn completed Handweavers Guild of America's (HGA) Certificate of Excellence in Handweaving (COE-W) with Level 1: Technical Skills in Handweaving completed in 2002. In October 2004, she successfully completed Level II: Master in Handweaving with the specialized study Loom-controlled Stitched Double Cloth.





Michigan Weavers Guild Presents a Workshop by Karen Donde "Turned Beiderwand: One Threading, Multiple Structures"

Karen Donde weaves garments, fashion accessories and home textiles for sale and teaches beginning-advanced weaving classes and assorted workshops for guilds and conferences. Teaching credits include HGA's Convergence 2012, 2014, & 2016, Southeast Fiber Forum, the Mid-Atlantic Fiber Assn.'s Workshop Weekend and Sutherland Handweaving Studio in Asheville, N.C. Karen is a juried member of the Southern Highland Craft Guild and a 2013 graduate of Haywood Community College's Professional Crafts-Fiber program.

An experienced and award-winning writer with a bachelor of journalism degree from the University of Missouri, Donde now writes for and about weavers. She is a contributor to Handwoven magazine and its Weaving Today email newsletter, and serves on the magazine's Editorial Advisory Board.

Workshop Description: Turning a beiderwand draft creates clean pattern blocks, better drape and faster, one-shuttle weaving than its traditional supplementary weft method. The resulting threading also adapts easily to weave other structures. Students will warp with a supplementary warp and weave samples, learning how to turn a draft and make do without a second warp beam. Level: Intermediate

Workshop Format: This workshop requires at least 6 shafts, though 8 shafts are preferred. More are fine, as every 2 shafts provides an additional pattern block. Each participant weaves a variety of samples on his/her own loom, as that's the fun of turning this draft. There will be several different drafts on looms to offer a variety of designs for discussion. Drafts are matched to loom style and weaver experience. A second warp beam is useful, but alternatives for weighting the pattern warps separately will be offered for those without. This is NOT a round robin workshop.

Students to supply: Pre-warped 8 shaft loom, shuttles, bobbins, wefts per leader's instructions, scissors, etc.
